▶ Consent Calendar

- ▶ Item 4: Certification of Warrant Register
 - ▶ City Council reviews and approves payment of City invoices. City invoices totaled approximately \$535,000 for the time period reviewed.
- ▶ Item 5: Waive Reading of Ordinances and Resolutions
 - ▶ To save time, the City Clerk will read only the titles of any Ordinances and Resolutions on the public agenda.
- ▶ Item 6: Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the City Council Held on July 7, 2015
- ▶ Item 7: June Treasurer's Report
 - ▶ The June 2015 Treasurer's Report provides information on the City's investment portfolio. All investments are in compliance with the City's Investment Policy.
- ▶ Item 8: First Amendment to Agreement with Advantage for Newsletter Printing and Mailing
 - ▶ City Council may approve an amendment with Advantage to continue providing newsletter printing and mailing services. The proposed amendment would extend the contract for an additional year through July 31, 2016, and increase compensation by \$98,316.02 for a total contract amount of \$194,867.02. Advantage would be responsible for printing *The Leaflet*, *Leisure Times*, and *In Business* newsletters, as well as various City brochures.

▶ Public Hearing

- ▶ Item 9: Appeal of the Planning Commission's Approval of a Determination of Public Convenience or Necessity for an ABC Type 20 Beer and Wine License for a Convenience Store Located at 24882 Muirlands Boulevard
 - ▶ A business, located in the El Toro Plaza West Shopping Center, filed an appeal to the Director of Development Services' denial of the issuance of a Public Convenience or Necessity (PCN) for a Type 20 alcohol license which was later approved by the Planning Commission. A Type 20 license is issued by the California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control and allows for the sale of beer and wine for off-site consumption. The City Council may approve, deny, or decline to act regarding the requested determination of a PCN.

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▶ Discussion

- ▶ Item 10: Agreement with the County of Orange for Law Enforcement Services
 - ▶ After being continued from the June 16, 2015 meeting, the City Council will consider approving a one-year contract with the Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) for law enforcement services. The proposed contract for Fiscal Year 2015-16 is \$14,210,900.
- ▶ Item 11: Discussion of Animal Control Services
 - ▶ Based upon City Council consensus at the June 16, 2015 meeting, this discussion item has been placed on the agenda. Since the City's incorporation, the County of Orange has provided animal control and shelter services through Orange County Animal Care (OCAC). OCAC provides services to eighteen cities and the County unincorporated area and its fees are set by the Orange County Board of Supervisors.
