- When speaking on an agenda item, please limit your comments to that agenda item and/or limit your comments to matters within the jurisdiction or official business of the City of Lake Forest.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES AND ANY ORDERS OR DIRECTIONS FROM THE PRESIDING CHAIR MAY RESULT IN A MISDEMEANOR AND/OR YOUR REMOVAL FROM THE MEETING. Lake Forest Municipal Code Section 2.04.030 states any person who disrupts a meeting by engaging in disorderly conduct, using loud or boisterous language, refusing to be seated or keep quiet when ordered to do so by the Mayor or other presiding officer, or otherwise impeding the orderly conduct of the meeting, is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to removal from the meeting. Also, Penal Code section 403 provides that, beyond removing meeting disruptors from the City Council Chambers, such persons may be arrested and prosecuted: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character ... is guilty of a misdemeanor." (Penal Code, § 403.)
