Director's Report

On February 15, 2023, the court denied the petitioners request in favor of OC Animal Care in the case of Hueg vs. OC Animal Care. With this litigation being resolved, our team is focusing more on assisting pets and people here in Orange County.

Unfortunately, the trend of low intake and high adoption rates that we saw during COVID-19 is starting to plateau, and in recent months, reversed. However, we're still on track budget-wise to come in at or under NOI in most cities.

Adoption Model

OCAC's adoption model continues to facilitate efficient adoptions. For many, reserving a time online to visit makes their overall experience more convenient. We are still taking walk-ins, but making an appointment online can reduce wait times to visit with animals.

Save Rates & Food Giveaways

Our overall save rate is just over 82%. Our dog save rate is 94.16% (well over the save rate we've been aiming for in our strategic plan) and our cat save rate is at 73.63%.

We've seen an uptick in the public's use of our pet food pantry. We assume this is related to inflation and other economic hardships people are facing. In 2022, we distributed over 85 tons of free pet food to individuals and families with pets in need.

Our current operational model protects the safety of staff, the community, and shelter pets as we work toward our mission of providing refuge and care for animals, fostering the human-animal bond, and promoting safety in our community.



The **Adoption Model**, which allows the community to drop by with or without prescheduling their visit, benefits both the animals and the potential adopters.



Field calls continue without interruption to protect and serve the community.



Our Foster Program is thriving. In 2022, our foster team fostered 2,237 animals!



Our **Rescue Program** matches behavioral and medical animals with rescue organizations trained to meet their individual needs.



Our **Pet Food Pantry** increased the amount of essential food and supplies provided to families in need by 87%.

Budget Update

FY 22/23 Update

- Based on actual expenses and revenues through Jan. 31, full-year Net Costs are projected above the combined NOI
 budget by about \$326K (2.2%)
 - Salary & Benefit expenses are projected under budget
 - ✓ Total filled positions have increased as anticipated
 - Services and Supplies expenses are projected above budget by \$889K (11.9%), driven by increased animal intake (animal charge days increased by 23.% between calendar 2021 vs. 2022) and inflation
 - ✓ Pharmaceuticals expenses are projected to exceed budget by 48%
 - ✓ Medical supplies expenses are projected to exceed budget by 24%
 - ✓ Animal feed expenses are projected to exceed budget by 76%
 - Fee revenue (animal licenses, late fees and charges for services) are projected below budget by approx. \$503K (6.5%)
 - ✓ The lower fee revenue has been partially offset from the receipt of approx. \$300K, to cover special adoption events, as well as animal supply purchases
 - Full year Net Cost projections will be provided to each City in the coming days
 - Industry Trends
 - ✓ Inflation
 - ✓ Shortage of veterinary services for communities
 - ✓ Length of stay (charge days) increasing across the nation
 - ✓ Decreased rate of adoption across the nation
 - ✓ OCAC is fortunate to have maintained current rate of adoption.

Operational Update

Challenges

Dog Population

- On av erage, 90-95% of av ailable dogs for adoption are adult age and over 25 pounds
 - Rental agreements often include weight limits and breed restrictions.
 - Many families are interested in a particular breed, age, and size not available at the shelter.
- OC Animal Care is experiencing an increase in stray dog intake.

Kitten Season

• An unusually long kitten season exacerbated by warmer than average temps and an increase in highly contagious life-threatening viral infections like panleukopenia.

OC Animal Care Pending Litigation

- In response to the Plaintiffs' allegations, OCAC submitted a declaration to the Court demonstrating that OCAC's practices meet or exceed industry standards.
- Plaintiffs' request for a temporary restraining order was denied by the Court on November 1.
- The judge issued a tentative ruling in favor of OCAC, and the case was heard in court on February 6.
- The judge DENIED petitioners' request in its entirety on February 15.


