A MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER **DEBRA ROSE**

Do you remember when jets from the Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) roared over Lake Forest? It's been 25 years since the base closed, but the legacy of the base will live in Lake Forest forever.

When the El Toro base was open, it brought men and women from around the country to the area. Many of them decided to make what is now Lake Forest their home as they retired from the service. When the base closed in 1999, it provided the City with an opportunity to reimagine Lake Forest because areas under the former flight paths were no longer restricted to commercial or industrial uses.

The City launched the planning process for the "Opportunities Study Area" ("OSA") and held more than 25 community meetings to see what residents would like their city to look like. After years of discussion, analysis, and deliberation, seven master-planned residential communities were approved, with a maximum of 5,400 homes.

Baker Ranch, Portola Center, Teresina, and Serrano Summit were all approved through the OSA. Studies found the new homes generate less than half of the average daily traffic than the commercial and industrial projects that could have been built under the previous zoning.

Fees generated by the development also allowed the City to build first-class public facilities for residents. The 86-acre Sports Park and Recreation Center opened in 2014, and the Civic Center, the City's 100-Year Home, opened in 2019. The Civic Center includes the Senior Clubhouse, ballrooms, and meeting rooms for rent in the Community Center, a 200-seat Performing Arts Center/Council Chambers, and City Hall. All of those facilities were financed primarily through developer fees, allowing Lake Forest to remain debt-free. The OSA also brought neighborhood parks, road improvements, and more.

Yes, a lot has changed in the 25 years since MCAS El Toro closed, and the City has grown from a population of 57,835 in 1999, before Foothill Ranch and Portola Hills became part of the City, to 85,600 today. But the foundation created by the base, the spirit of community developed through the OSA process, will always remain.

OFFICIALS CUT THE RIBBON FOR CITY'S THIRD AFFORDABLE HOUSING COMMUNITY

On March 1, National CORE and the City of Lake Forest celebrated the grand opening of Mountain View affordable housing community and the start of a new partnership to deliver affordable housing to residents in need.

Mountain View provides 71 affordable one-, two- and three-bedroom apartment homes to individuals and families who earn less than 60 percent of the area median income. It is near the El Toro Road corridor, within walking distance of schools, grocery stores and retail shops.

The City contributed \$3.7 million in in-lieu housing fees for the Mountain View community. The project is Lake Forest's third affordable housing community and National CORE's eighth affordable housing community in Orange County, totaling 970 affordable apartments.

"It was an absolute thrill to partner with Lake Forest to bring such a magnificent property to completion," National CORE President Michael Ruane said. "Mountain View marks our first partnership with Lake Forest to bring more stateof-the-art affordable housing to those in need. It is an honor to work with such an amazing partner."

Following LEED standards, Mountain View is sustainable, durable and energy efficient. The community's design includes photovoltaic solar panels, plumbing systems that limit water waste, drought-tolerant native plants and rainwater retention systems to reduce irrigation demands.

On-site amenities include a community center with computer access and warming kitchen, laundry facilities and a beautiful courtyard with a playground.

National CORE's affiliated nonprofit, the Hope through Housing Foundation, will provide resident services at the community. "Housing is just one piece of the larger solution to combat homelessness and fight the generational cycle of poverty. Hope through Housing's programs are the other piece, giving our residents the tools and guidance, they need to grow and thrive," Hope through Housing Vice President Alyssa Cotter said.

Hope through Housing will collaborate with the Boys & Girls Club of Laguna Beach to provide free after-school and summer programs as well as services for families and seniors that include GED classes, job preparation, parenting and financial coaching, and health and wellness activities.

Construction on Mountain View began in December 2021; the community welcomed its first residents in January 2024. The development has been supported by Wells Fargo, the California Community Reinvestment Corporation, Century Housing, the Orange County Housing Finance Trust, Orange County Health Care Agency and OC Housing & Community Development.

NEW AFFORDABLE SENIOR HOUSING COMMUNITIES

Mountain View is the City's third affordable housing community, joining the 189-unit Arroyo at Baker Ranch family apartments and the 57-unit Portola Senior Apartments. In collaboration with OC Animal Care, the county agency contracted to provide animal-control services in Lake Forest, responsible pet ownership has been and continues to be emphasized to ensure the safety and well-being of all residents, human and canine alike.

Introducing #LeashUpLF, Lake Forest's Dog Leash Campaign:

The campaign is aimed at educating and empowering pet owners to embrace responsible pet ownership. Through a series of community outreach efforts, including social media campaigns, informational booths, and park signage, the City worked to spread awareness about the importance of leash laws and pet safety.

On-Leash, Please:

Always keep dogs on a leash no longer than six feet when outside your private property. This simple rule helps prevent unwanted encounters and promotes safety, especially around other animals, and children.

Designated Play Zones:

Unleash the fun in designated dog parks! Barker Ranch Park and Portola Dog Park offer safe spaces for off-leash play. Remember, part of being a responsible pet owner is cleaning up after your furry friend, even in these designated areas.

Beyond the Leash:

Responsible pet ownership extends beyond leash laws. Ensure your dog is properly licensed, vaccinated, and well-trained. Be mindful of your dog's behavior, including barking at home or on walks, and respect the boundaries of others.

Benefits of Following Leash Laws:

- · Reduced risk of incidents and injuries.
- · Enhanced enjoyment for all park users.
- · Strengthened bond between you and your pet.

OC Animal Care will patrol City parks to enforce leash laws and other pet ordinances. Fines for violations start at \$250 and can escalate up to \$403.

Remember, responsible pet ownership is a shared commitment that fosters a safe and welcoming environment for everyone. Let's keep Lake Forest a happy and healthy place for all, one leash at a time!

El Toro's Legacy: FROM PROUD BASE TO BOOMING COMMUNITY

Marine Corps Air Station El Toro (MCAS El Toro) was born in the aftermath of the attack on Pearl Harbor, on nearly 5,000 acres of lima bean fields the government bought from farmer James Irvine for \$100,000. The population of Orange County at the time – 1943 – was about 150,000.

The base got its name from the small community next door – now Lake Forest. The community and county grew as the base grew. MCAS El Toro drew Marines and their families from throughout the United States as El Toro-based fighter planes – first propeller-driven, then jets — battled in the skies during World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Desert Storm, and more.

The El Toro "Flying Bull" patch was designed by Walt Disney Studios in 1944. Air Force 1 used the base to ferry Presidents. The Black Sheep Squadron, made famous (or infamous) by Gregory "Pappy" Boyington, founder of the famed Black Sheep Squadron, was based at El Toro after the Korean Conflict. Robert Conrad, who played Boyington on television, was stationed at MCAS El Toro, as was actor Tyrone Powers, future astronaut and senator John Glenn and baseball legend Ted Williams. A local favorite was the MCAS El Toro Air Show, which took place annually from the 1950s until 1997. It regularly featured the Blue Angels and drew hundreds of thousands to the base.

Many former Marines called Lake Forest home when the City incorporated in 1991. Even after its closure on July 2, 1999, the base continued to shape Lake Forest. Property owners whose land was set for commercial or industrial projects because it was in former flight paths asked the City to change their zoning to allow homes. After more than two dozen community meetings, seven new communities were approved. The changes ultimately generated development fees to pay for new roads, the Sports Park and Recreation Center, and Civic Center complex.

"The closure of Marine Corps Air Station El Toro has had a lasting impact on Orange County and the City of Lake Forest," said Chris Epting, an OC historian who wrote about the base in his book, Lost Landmarks of Orange County. "While the base played a significant role in the region during its operation, its closure presented both challenges and opportunities for the area that continue to shape the landscape and community to this day."

I was welcomed into the Marine Corps family. That year my husband would also wrap up his Marine Corps service.

Growing up in Lake Forest, near two USMC bases (El Toro and Tustin), shaped us as a community, as citizens (listening to the air show and watching the Blue Angels each year was a thrill), as a family (we had many dear friends who served in the military at the local bases around our dinner table on holidays), and it also shaped me personally.

I'm so grateful for our service men and women and especially grateful that living adjacent to MCAS El Toro brought my husband of many years. While he is humble about his military service, I'm outwardly proud of him. He's an amazing man and I'm forever grateful! What a blessing to me, to my family and friends.

Fueling Imagination

It was 1942. World War II was going on and was very real to me and my family for many reasons, but especially because my older brother, Bill, was serving our country in the Philippine Islands.

The old folks loved to gather at the end of the day to tell stories about the day and about the war. I could hardly contain my happiness to learn that the new air base was being built in El Toro. It was to be named the El Toro Marine Base.

One day, my imagination was not enough to fill my dreams of being on a plane, so I decided to build my own CORSAIR! I knew it would be difficult to build a CORSAIR with the upswept wings, so I settled on the idea of building a P-51 Mustang, just like the one I had seen in the comic book.

I borrowed one of my father's wooden horses for the body of the plane, my propeller was a part of a broken-down umbrella, the instrument panel was made up of gauges and dials of an old junk car mounted on a wooden panel, and the seat was a perforated steel seat from an old farm plow. This Mustang airplane was very low cost, as I had found all the parts in my father's junk pile. The tail section and wings were small and carefully cut with an axe to resemble the real things.

After I completed the engineering and production of the airplane, I was on call 12 hours a day to contribute my part to help the war effort. Every time during my waking hours when I heard the engines at El Toro Base, I would say good-bye to my mother and I would run to my airplane in the yard, put my hat on and mount my plane as it joined the squadron which took off flying overhead and into the clouds high above our home.

In my imagination, I could fly anywhere, anytime, and with the best of the best. I was an Ace!

The Noncommissioned Officer

This is just my recollection of my time at El Toro Marine Air Station from May of 1965 to October of 1966. At that time El Toro was the showplace Air Station of the entire Marine Corps. If the Marine Corps wanted to show off its stuff they brought them to El Toro. Commandant of the Marine Corps, Secretary of the Navy, Foreign Military leaders, President Nixon flew into El Toro when he spent time in San Clemente at his

I was assigned to VMF-334 Marine Aircraft group 11 Third Marine Aircraft Wing MCAS El Toro, after serving Western White House. 13 months overseas. At that time there was nothing in the way of cities or towns near El Toro, the closest town was Tustin up the Santa Ana Freeway (it wasn't referred to as "the 5" then) about 15 miles.

Nothing but orange groves bean fields as far as the eye could see.

My Squadron at the time was flying F8-U Chance Vought Fighter aircraft, supersonic single seat fighter aircraft. I was the Noncommissioned Officer, in Charge of the flight line. That entailed supervising the maintenance of the aircraft to ensure their flight readiness.

We flew anywhere from 10 to 20 flights a day, sometimes beginning at 0500 until 2200. Long days.

My Commanding officer was Lt. Col. Albert Pommerenk who finished his career as a Brigadier General.

That was good duty, I enjoyed my time there. I was discharged from active duty in October of 1966, moved around and wound up back in Lake Forest in 2013.

Quite a difference!

VACATION HOME CHECKS: PEACE OF MIND WHILE YOU'RE AWAY

Planning your next vacation? Don't leave your home's security to chance. Lake Forest Police Services can offer you peace of mind with complimentary Vacation Home Checks. The Police Services team will conduct a thorough physical exterior check of your residence to ensure its security while you're away for up to four consecutive weeks.

This service is available to homes occupied by homeowners or renters. Homes listed for sale are not eligible.

To take advantage of the Vacation Home Checks program, complete the easy-to-use Vacation Home Check Form (PDF) available for download on the city's website, www. lakeforestca.gov/vacationhomechecks.

Submit the completed form via email, fax, or in person at 100 Civic Center Dr. at least five days before your departure date. This ensures that OCSD can process your request promptly and efficiently.

OC SHERIFF PARTNERS WITH THE OC HEALTH CARE AGENCY TO SUPPORT INDIVIDUALS IN CRISIS

In March 2024, the Orange County Sheriff's Department, in partnership with the OC Health Care Agency (HCA), launched a program to better serve those experiencing homelessness or mental health disorders.

Sheriff's Department dispatchers now triage non-violent, non-criminal behavioral health and homeless-related calls for service to determine if they can be diverted to OC Links, the 24-hour, seven days a week Behavioral Health Line, an entry point for the OC HCA's continuum of care providing information, referral, linkage, screening, homeless outreach, and dispatching of mobile crisis response teams.

Dispatchers, using a series of intake questions, will triage calls to determine if a deputy response is required. If the call is determined to be non-violent and non-criminal, dispatch will transfer the caller to OC Links, where they will be connected with a trained navigator.

"When an individual is experiencing homelessness or a mental health crisis, our goal is always to provide the most effective response possible," said Orange County Sheriff-Coroner Don Barnes.

"This diversion program allows us to connect individuals in need of expert behavioral health support with the best resources."

The Orange County Sheriff's Department receives about 10,000 calls for service each year involving mental health, individuals experiencing homelessness, and similar crises. OC Links provides specifically trained navigators who specialize in connecting individuals experiencing mental health disorders, homelessness, or substance use disorders with appropriate behavioral health services and field outreach.

OC Links dispatches counselors to non-violent and non-criminal calls instead of deputies, allowing deputies to be more readily available for in-progress crimes and proactive policing.

If additional assistance is needed or requested, deputies and/or fire personnel will be dispatched.

"This partnership between the Orange County Sheriff's Department



and OC Health Care Agency exemplifies our commitment to providing comprehensive support for individuals in crisis," said OC Health Care Agency Director Dr. Veronica Kelley. "By integrating law enforcement and behavioral health expertise, we can better address the complex needs of our community."

The Sheriff's Department continues to deploy its Behavioral Health Bureau teams in partnership with OC HCA Psychiatric Emergency Response Teams (PERT), responsible for proactively contacting and supporting those experiencing mental health crises and homelessness in the community, and connecting individuals with resources including housing programs, counseling services, and other support services.

In Lake Forest, a specially trained deputy works with a City outreach worker to get to know individuals experiencing homelessness to gain their trust and find appropriate treatment or housing programs for them. See more about the City's efforts at www.lakeforestca.gov/homelessresources.

SUMMER SWIMMING SAFETY

Summer brings sunshine and opportunities for fun around the pool and beach, but also carries some dangers.

In 2023, 104 drowning incidents were reported in Orange County. Tragically, half of them were fatal. The statistics include children and adults.

The Orange County Fire Authority wants everyone to remember the ABCs of Water safety:

A IS FOR ADULT SUPERVISION

- · Keep infants and toddlers within arm's reach
- No one should ever swim alone, even adults
- Never rely on water wings, rafts, or anything but U.S.
 Coast Guard approved life jackets
- Assign an adult to be a water watcher, keeping an eye out without distractions
- If a child is missing, every second counts check the water first!

B IS FOR BARRIERS

- Install and maintain proper fencing around the pool and spa
- Use multiple layers of protection, such as doors, fences, gates, and alarms
- Use self-closing, self-latching gates that open outward, away from the pool
- Remove items such as chairs or tables that a child could use to climb a safety fence

OIS FOR CLASSES

- · Learn to swim by taking lessons
- Learn first aid and CPR. Always keep a phone nearby to call 911
- Teach children that running, jumping and pushing others on pool decks is dangerous

IS FOR DRAIN SAFETY

- Keep children away from pool and spa drains to avoid entrapment
- Keep long hair tied back and remove dangling items like jewelry or bathing suits
- Install compliant safety drain covers and auto-shutoff pump systems
- Know where the pool and spa pump switch is and how to turn it off



GREEN SPRING CLEANING AND GARDENING

Have you noticed a buildup of dirt and debris around your garage, your patio, and all around your home? Perhaps you have seen garden pests on your favorite flowers? As the spring weather urges you to start working outdoors, it is important to remember that anything that gets washed down to the gutter ends up in local creeks, lakes, and the ocean. Utilizing green alternatives can protect our local resources from pollution such as pesticides. It's not hard to protect your home using common household items, while also protecting our local creeks, lakes, and the ocean! Here's a few tips:

Green Gardening and Pest Control

A combination of preventative maintenance and green insect repellents can keep insects out of your home and garden. Insects are looking for food, water and shelter – if you eliminate these necessities, they won't forage in your home or your garden!

- Keep plants trimmed at least three or four feet away from doors and window frames to eliminate these common pest entrances.
- Trim overhanging tree limbs that might provide an insect or rodent on-ramp to your home.
- Check the areas around your home for any debris or garbage – identify anything that could be used by pests as shelter - and get rid of it.

Did you know a variety of common household items can be used to repel insects?

- The strong smell of garlic and cayenne can be used to deter a variety of bugs, especially aphids. Chopping 6 cloves of garlic and mixing them with 1 tablespoon of baby shampoo in 4 cups of water in a spray bottle creates an effective repellent for your rose bushes.
- Mixing 5 tablespoons of dish soap with 4 cups of water in a spray bottle can be used to deter aphids and spider mites
- Spices like black pepper, chili pepper, dill, ginger and paprika contain capsaicin, which repels spider mites

and other insects. Make a solution of 2 tablespoons red pepper, 6 drops of dish soap, and 4 cups of water for deterring insects on your growing vegetables.

- Coffee and crushed eggshells can be sprinkled around the base of plants to repel ants, snails, and slugs (and they are great on azaleas, rhododendrons, camellias, gardenias, and even blueberries!)
- To keep wasps away from ripening fruit, fill several cans with equal parts ammonia and water, and hang them among your fruit trees.
- Crushed mint, bay leaves, cloves, and eucalyptus wrapped in small cheesecloth squares can also be hung in your home and your garden as a natural repellent.

Green Cleaning

Using green cleaning methods can prevent the transfer of pollutants to the storm drain system!

- Use a broom and a dustpan to clean your patio and outdoor walkways instead of a hose.
- Use a spray nozzle on your hose with an automatic shut-off and turn the flow of water completely off when not actively washing down your automobile.
- Cleaning your patio furniture on your lawn or other landscaped areas can save you water by providing your plants with a drink, and it keeps our gutters clean too!
- Wash vehicles over pervious surfaces like lawns and gravel areas. If unpaved areas are not available, block and/or divert wash water towards other landscaped areas, like planters. If using cleaners (such as acid based wheel cleaners), use a rag to wipe them on and off. do not rinse them off with water.
- Shake floor mats onto landscaping, into trash cans or vacuum to clean, never shake off in the gutter.
