CITY OF LAKE FOREST

The City of Lake Forest is in the heart of South Orange County, set against the beautiful Saddleback Mountains. Residents voted to incorporate the city in 1991 and selected "Lake Forest" over "El Toro" as the City's name. Eight years later the Marine Corps Air Station El Toro Base closed.

Careful planning preserved the City's rich heritage, revitalized commercial centers for shopping and business, and dedicated open space for recreation and relaxation.

The City is home to 32 beautiful parks and one of the largest skateparks in the state. Residents can enjoy more than 250 eateries, celebrate the community spirit at more than 30 annual events, and hike, bike, run, or trek along 58 miles of scenic trails.

Lake Forest is a debt-free city that lives within its means and invests in improving the overall quality of life for those who live, work, and play here.









CITY GOVERNMENT

Five City Council Members are elected by a geographic district and serve four-year terms. The City Council provides directives and sets policies for the City Manager to implement and carry out with staff. City Council meets on the first and third Tuesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Lake Forest Civic Center, 100 Civic Center Drive.

The City also relies on the Community Services, Planning, and Traffic and Parking Commissions to review and provide directives on specific matters. Each commission is comprised of five residents that the City Council appoints. Commissioners serve four-year terms. Each commission meets during the first full week of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Lake Forest Civic Center. The Traffic and Parking Commission meets on Monday, Community Services Commission meets on Wednesday, and the Planning Commission meets on Thursday.

CITY OPERATIONS

Lake Forest contracts with the Orange County Sheriff's Department and Orange County Fire Authority, which keeps costs low and allows Lake Forest to be one of the country's largest debt-free cities. The City's landscape maintenance, road repair, animal control, and other services are also contracted out.

CITY FACILITIES

The City offers several amenities for residents to enjoy. The Lake Forest Civic Center and the Lake Forest Sports Park and Recreation Center were paid for with development fees, not tax dollars. When the Marine Corps Air Station El Toro Base closed, the land was rezoned for housing. Landowners were required to pay a fee per home which generated money for the City to use later.

Civic Center Campus

The Civic Center, 100 Civic Center Drive, is home to City Hall, the Lake Forest Police Services Substation, the Council Chambers that doubles as a Performing Arts Center, a Conference and Community Center, and the Senior Clubhouse.



The **Conference/Community Center** is a grand facility that offers banquet and meeting rooms as well as a courtyard for rent. Each space ranges in size and amenities to accommodate a variety of events including, weddings, luncheons, ceremonies, and conferences.

The **Performing Arts Center** is a state-of-the-art 200-seat theater with professional sound and lighting, dressing rooms, ticket booth, and an open courtyard. The space is available for public use for a variety of performances, musicals, concerts, seminars, shows, and more.





The **Senior Clubhouse** offers several activities, programs, and services including wellness classes, bingo, crafts, and transportation to residents who are 50+. The facility is open Monday - Thursday from 10 a.m. - 3 p.m.

CITY FACILITIES

Lake Forest Sports Park and Recreation Center

The Sports Park, 28000 Rancho Parkway, offers 57 acres of space for various sports fields, camps, leagues, and recreational activities/programs.



Etnies Skatepark of Lake Forest


The skatepark, 20028 Lake Forest Drive, is one the largest in California and offers skate classes, camps, lessons, special events, and birthday parties to its park users.
