Remember when we were kids and we were excited because summer meant no school? Well, summer in Lake Forest means fun and excitement for all ages! Our special events are a great way to enjoy the beautiful parks and facilities in the City and share time with family and friends.

July 26 brings the band Family Style, playing classics from the 70s to today, to the Sports Park, which is home to many of our summer events. A couple weeks later, the City, Orange County Sheriff's Department, and Orange County Fire Authority bring "National Night Out" back to the Sports Park.

National Night Out started in 1984 as a way to bring law enforcement officers and the communities they serve together. The first annual National Night Out involved 2.5 million neighbors across 400 communities in 23 states. We are fortunate to have great partners in public safety and they always bring out their best tools and equipment to share with us on the first Tuesday each August. A highlight is watching one of the Sheriff's helicopters land in the park, then seeing it up close!

The last concert of the summer is August 23, and our staff always make sure it is special. This year, the concert includes a car show and two bands: Diego's Garage – appropriate for the car show – plays 90s rock, followed by the 80s tribute band Flashback Heart Attack.

There will be food trucks at all of the concerts, as well as a beer and wine booth organized by the Chamber of Commerce.

The City also partners with the Chamber for the Taste of Lake Forest, which returns this year to Heritage Hill Historical Park. This event still features great tastes from our local restaurants but has evolved into a fun evening out with live music in a truly special setting. The Taste is set for 4:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Friday August 15, 2025. It sold out last year, so watch our website, www.lakeforestca.gov, for information on that event and all of the other concerts and movies that make Lake Forest a great place to celebrate summer.

COUNCIL APPROVES 2025-2027 OPERATING BUDGET THAT MAINTAINS ALL CITY SERVICES

The City of Lake Forest adopted a balanced two-year operating budget in June for Fiscal Years 2025-26 and 2026-27, continuing its commitment to fiscal responsibility and high-quality municipal services.

Lake Forest remains one of the largest debt-free cities in California.

The total projected revenue is \$85.2 million for FY 2025-26 and \$85 million for FY 2026-27. Total operating expenditures are budgeted at \$94.3 million for FY 2025-26 and \$86.3 million for FY 2026-27. The City reduced the FY 2025-26 operating budget by \$1.7 million from the previous year, with cuts to contractual services and materials costs.

Although expenditures appear to outpace revenues, the budgets are balanced because expenditures include funds accumulated for infrastructure projects. The City anticipates increases in property and sales tax revenues and projects the 2025-26 operating budget will generate a surplus of \$4.8 million, while the 2026-27 budget will generate a surplus of \$4.4 million

Public safety is a top priority. The contract with the Orange County Sheriff's Department and other public-safety efforts account for 37 percent of General Fund expenditures in FY 2025-26. The City's contract with OCSD is projected to increase by \$1.4 million in each of the two years and includes the addition of a patrol deputy.

The City's Risk Analysis calls for a target General Fund reserve level of \$80 million and a minimum reserve of \$76 million. That's in addition to operating surpluses of \$26.5 million projected over the next five years.

The budget supports Lake Forest's ongoing transition into a maintenance-focused municipality as large residential developments are completed, ensuring that existing infrastructure and services are sustained while maintaining a strong financial foundation.

INVESTING IN OUR FUTURE: 2025-2027 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS BUDGET

The City's 2025-2027 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) outlines a \$38.4 million investment across 45 infrastructure projects designed to improve safety, enhance traffic flow, and maintain public amenities over the next two fiscal years.

The CIP budget is separate from the \$94.3 million General Fund budget, which is more like the City's checkbook for day-to-day expenses. The CIP budget includes projects focused on improving parks, streets, and traffic systems.

Park improvements are a significant portion of the CIP, with trail connections, renovations to Cavanaugh Park and Peachwood Park, and updates at the Lake Forest Sports Park. Slope landscaping at Heroes Park and upgrades at the Normandale Open Space Area are also planned.

Traffic-related projects include new audible pedestrian signals funded through federal Community Development Block Grants, synchronization of traffic signals on major corridors such as Bake Parkway and Rockfield, and the addition of second left-turn lanes at the intersection of Los Alisos and Muirlands. Major intersection improvements at Jeronimo and El Toro Road are also planned to ease congestion.

Street maintenance projects are also a core focus. Residential slurry seal programs, ADA ramp installations, and crosswalk enhancements in Southwest Lake Forest are scheduled to maintain and improve pedestrian and vehicular safety. Planned median improvements at Rockfield and El Toro are expected to enhance safety and community appearance.

The 2025-2027 CIP reflects Lake Forest's proactive approach to preserving and enhancing city infrastructure. With careful planning and prioritization, the City aims to address current community needs while preparing for future growth, ensuring residents can continue to enjoy safe, accessible, and attractive parks and public spaces.

LAKE FOREST ADDS NEW DEPUTY TO STRENGTHEN PUBLIC SAFETY

The City of Lake Forest is bolstering its public safety team by adding a new patrol deputy to its ranks for the 2025-26 fiscal year, according to an agreement with the Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) approved by the City Council in May.

The \$22,738,891 agreement represents a 6.45 percent increase -- about \$1.37 million -- over last year's law enforcement budget. Much of the increase is driven by labor costs and the hiring of one new deputy, which is key to maintaining Lake Forest's low crime rate and effective emergency response.


The new deputy's position is the first in a phased approach to keeping pace with the City's growth and maintaining strong police visibility.

The addition brings the City's total sworn OCSD patrol deputies from 46 to 47. The change follows months of evaluation by the Public Safety Ad-Hoc Committee, which analyzed trends in population, crime, response times, and budget capacity.

Since becoming a city in 1991, Lake Forest has contracted with OCSD for law enforcement, a model used throughout South County that provides cost efficiency and access to specialized regional policing units such as air support, SWAT, and highly trained traffic accident investigators.

The need for more staff became necessary as Lake Forest grew by almost 13 percent from 2010 to 2024. Over that period, response times for life-threatening "Priority 1" calls increased from 4 minutes and 13 seconds to 5 minutes and 11 seconds. Meanwhile, the time deputies spend on preventative patrol also decreased, as more time is consumed responding to calls and performing administrative duties.

Adding a deputy creates capacity for officers to engage with the community, deter crime, and respond more quickly when emergencies occur. The City also converted



Public feedback also supports the move. In the City's most recent Community Satisfaction Survey, more than 90 percent of residents cited maintaining a low crime rate as a top priority. More than 80 percent said they were satisfied with the City's police services.

The City remains one of the safest in Orange County, averaging around 950 Part 1 crimes annually -- a number that has remained relatively stable despite regional increases and changes in crime-reporting standards.

The City Council is also considering the addition of a second new deputy in the 2026-27 fiscal year, pending future budget approval.

Lake Forest's financial management, including its status as one of the largest debt-free cities in the state, allows it to absorb the cost of the new deputy, estimated at about \$450,000 in the first year and \$350,000 in future years. The costs include the equipment the deputy will use, such as a patrol unit and body-worn camera.

The City of Lake Forest is proud to recognize Deputy Harm's continued dedication to public safety and service. His exemplary performance reflects the highest standards of professionalism and commitment, and serves as an example of excellence in law enforcement.



DEPUTY MELENDREZ RECOGNIZED FOR BRAVERY, SWIFT ACTION IN EMERGENCY RESCUE

Deputy Anthony Melendrez was honored with the Medal for Lifesaving at the 36th Annual Medal of Valor Luncheon, hosted by the Sheriff's Advisory Council. On May 26, 2024, Deputy Melendrez responded to a critical emergency at a Lake Forest residence, performing CPR for more than two minutes until paramedics arrived. Thanks to his quick response and life-saving actions, the individual was transported to the hospital and went on to make a full recovery.

Honored for his bravery and presence of mind during a moment of crisis, Deputy Melendrez demonstrated the composure, skill, and commitment that reflect the highest ideals of public service. His actions exemplify the integrity and dedication of the deputies who serve the Lake Forest community.





CITY OF LAKE FOREST HOUSING REHABILITATION LOAN PROGRAM

The City of Lake Forest Housing Rehabilitation Program offers a zero percent (0%) deferred interest loan for homes, condominiums and mobile homes. To qualify for this loan provided by the City, you must first meet the required income qualifications. As part of the review process, current household income and income for the past two years will be evaluated.

The zero percent interest deferred loan has no monthly payments. Total payment is due if you are no longer residing in the home, at the time of sale, refinance or transfer of title. Mobile homeowners are eligible to receive up to \$25,000 and homeowners are eligible to receive up to \$40,000.

Additional requirements include, but are not limited to, residing on the property, not having received prior assistance, meeting asset limitations, and having sufficient equity in the home.

Most home improvement items are eligible for assistance. However, any code violations or health and safety issues in the home MUST be corrected as a condition of funding. Any homes built prior to January 1, 1978, must meet the new federal regulations regarding lead-based paint.

Eligible repairs for this program include stucco, windows, painting, roofing, plumbing, electrical, energy and weatherization items, garage doors, fumigation, flooring and other items necessary for the health and safety of occupants. Ineligible items include room additions, barbecue pits, ceiling fans, swimming pools, fireplaces, and other improvements deemed non-essential.

CITY OF LAKE FOREST PAINT PROGRAM

The City established its Paint Grant Program to help maintain and improve the character, aesthetic quality and property values within the community. This program is funded by the City's Community Development Block Grant and provides the opportunity for qualified homeowners to have the exterior of their home painted and treated for termites, as necessary. Grants for single family homes cannot exceed \$12,000 and mobile homeowners cannot exceed \$7,500.

To qualify for the Paint Grant Program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The property must be owner-occupied.
- 2. The home or mobile home must be in need of painting, as determined by the City.
- 3. Owners may not have assets in excess of \$75,000, excluding the value of the home.
- 4. The existing exterior paint must be lead-free.
- 5. The household's income must not exceed the moderate-income limits listed to the right, based on household size, as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the previous two years.

IRRIGATION, POLLUTION & PUBLIC SAFETY POWER SHUTOFF (PSPS)

Did you know that about 50 percent of residential water use goes toward landscape irrigation? An inefficient or outdated irrigation system can waste water, raise your utility bill, and contribute to pollution. By maintaining your system and preventing irrigation runoff, you help protect local waterways, conserve valuable resources, and save money.

Most irrigation controllers rely on a steady power source to maintain their programming. While many have backup batteries for outages, those batteries may no longer hold a charge. If the backup power supply is lost, your controller could reset to its factory settings, causing excessive irrigation and runoff. This type of runoff is

prohibited, as it can carry pollutants such as sediment, bacteria, and nutrients into local creeks, lakes, and the ocean.

To reduce wildfire risk, local energy providers have been implementing Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS), more commonly known as power outages. These have become more frequent due to ongoing drought conditions and elevated fire danger. Unfortunately, this safety measure can also reset your irrigation system and lead to unintentional runoff pollution.

HOW CAN YOU PREVENT WATER RUNOFF WASTE AND POLLUTION?

- Routinely replace backup batteries in your irrigation controller to ensure they hold a charge. Consider doing this when you check smoke detector batteries.
- After a PSPS, check your irrigation controller to confirm it hasn't reset to factory settings.
- Adjust irrigation schedules seasonally based on weather conditions and plant needs. For example, plants typically require more water in summer than in winter.
