A MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER **DEBRA ROSE**

The New Year is just under way, but we've already got big plans for 2024.

You'll read more about some of the projects in this issue of *The Leaflet*, but the City's goals for the year include everything from bringing back the popular Taste of Lake Forest event with the Chamber of Commerce, to launching an enhanced parking-enforcement team.

I know we talk a lot about parks, but the City is committed to providing clean, updated parks for residents. It's always great to visit one of our 31 parks and see people walking, children playing, and sports events underway. This year, the City will:

- Reach out to the community for input on Cavanaugh, Peachwood, Nature and Lake Forest Parks.
- Conduct a citywide pickleball court analysis to see if existing tennis and other courts can be repurposed for pickleball.
- Install a Box Lacrosse Rink at Foothill Ranch Community Park.

Other projects are in the design phase, including the synthetic turf replacement at Barker Ranch Dog Park, new lighting at Heroes Park, updates at Etnies Skate Park of Lake Forest, and more. I hope you had the chance to attend the 20th Anniversary Celebration of the skatepark in December; but if you missed out, watch our social media for another big event, as our Sports Park turns 10 in November.

We're probably as proud of our streets as we are our parks. Neighborhood streets in the northwest portion of the City are being resurfaced now, and that work will move east later this year. Construction will also begin on Trabuco Road with a left-turn holding pocket at Ascension Cemetery, resurfacing, and the asphalt trail rehabilitation.

And finally, the popular buy-one-get-one gift card program is back. You can buy one gift card for \$100 and get another for \$100. They're accepted at 100 Lake Forest businesses. See more about that program at www.lakeforestca.gov/giftcard.

This is just a few of the many projects we have lined up, and we'll be asking for your input on many of them, so please stay tuned to our website, www.lakeforestca.gov, and social media channels.

LEASH LAWS AND WAGGING TAILS: HOW PET LAWS KEEP EVERYONE HAPPY

Giant grins, loving licks, and puppy dog eyes can tug hard on the hearts of pet owners – causing some parents to bend the rules and break certain pet laws for their furry babies. But off-leash dogs are not only violating City ordinances, they can make other park users uncomfortable, and even pose a threat to people and other animals.

After an uptick in complaints about dogs off leash in Lake Forest parks, City leaders asked OC Animal Care, which provides animal-control services to the City, to increase enforcement.

The County of Orange encourages responsible pet ownership through ordinances intended to keep pets, owners, and the public safe.

On-Leash, Please:

Always keep your dog on a leash no longer than six feet when off your private property. This simple rule helps prevent accidental run-ins with other animals or people, especially children.

Designated Play Zones:

Unleash the fun in designated dog parks! Only Barker Ranch Park (25650 Baffin Bay Dr.) and Portola Dog Park (28040 Glenn Ranch Rd.) allow off-leash play. Remember, responsible pet ownership means cleaning up after your dog, even in designated areas.

Beyond the Leash:

Leash laws are just one aspect of responsible pet ownership. Make sure your dog is properly licensed, vaccinated, and well-trained. Be a courteous neighbor by controlling your dog's barking and keeping them away from others unless invited.

Benefits of Following Leash Laws:

- · Reduced risk of dog bites and injuries.
- Safer and more enjoyable experience for everyone at parks and public spaces.
- Stronger bond of trust and control between you and your dog.

OC Animal Care will patrol City parks to cite people violating the leash law as well as other pet ordinances including:

- No dog, except a guide dog or service dog, can be on public school property, public beaches, or certain county parks.
- A person in custody of a dog is required to exercise "due care or control" over them by picking up after the dog.
- Owners of a dog four months old or older must vaccinate the dog against rabies if not already.

Fines start at \$250 for a first offense and can go up to \$403. Visit ocpetinfo.com to see the County's list of other animal ordinances.

By following these guidelines, you can ensure that your furry friend has a safe and enjoyable time while respecting the rights and safety of others. Remember, responsible pet ownership is a shared responsibility that makes Lake Forest a happy and healthy place for everyone!





OC ANIMAL CARE OPENS DOORS WIDER WITH NEW VISITATION AND VIEWING HOURS

The Orange County Animal Shelter is now making it easier than ever for the community to connect with furry friends, thanks to expanded access through new visitation and viewing hours!

Following the successful "All Summer Long Pilot Program" and overwhelming community support, the shelter is excited to announce:

- Adoption Visits: Daily from 11 AM to 5 PM. Schedule an appointment or walk-in to meet your potential new best friend!
- Viewing Hours: Daily from 2 PM to 5 PM. Stroll through the designated areas to get acquainted with the adoptable animals.

Scheduled Adoption Visits will remain available for the convenience of potential adopters, while walk-in visitors are welcome to the next available time slot. Adoption visits include one-on-one meet and greets with the specific pet(s) you are interested in adopting. Visitors may spend time with multiple dogs and each time slot includes up to 30 minutes of dedicated time with an Animal Care Team member. Adoption visits for cats, rabbits, or other animals include staff assisted walk-throughs of available pets that are ready-to-go-home the same day.

During Viewing Hours, the community is invited to visit the shelter to walk unescorted through the external side of dog kennels and large viewing cat rooms, which feature dogs and cats who are available for adoption with no major medical or behavioral concerns, and ready-to-go-home the same day.

OC Animal Care understands that finding the right pet goes beyond the surface. It's about compatibility, shared energy, and a connection that lasts a lifetime. OC Animal Care has a variety of amazing animals, including dogs, ranging from energetic puppies to gentle seniors, and everything in between. CITY ROLLS OUT IN-HOUSE PARKING ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM

Lake Forest is beefing up patrols for problem parkers.

Lake Forest contracts with the Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) for general law enforcement and parking enforcement. Parking enforcement is primarily handled by Community Services Officers (CSO), who patrol and issue parking citations and handle citation appeals. The City's agreement with OCSD includes five CSOs, however, only three of the five positions are filled because recruitment and retention issues.

The lack of staff has led to a drop in parking citations and a rise in residents' complaints. To combat this issue, the City will implement an in-house parking enforcement program consisting of two part-time Parking Control Officers (PCO) who will help mitigate the shortfall created by the lack of CSO staffing. The new part-time parking officers will enforce street sweeping parking restrictions, neighborhood permit parking, and illegal parking. The City's citation review process will remain under the OCSD.

The parking enforcement program is a part of the City's Strategic Plan and supports the City's goal of being a well-planned, attractive, and safe community. The estimated first-year cost to establish the program inhouse is \$109,000, which covers the part-time salaries of the two PCOS and the purchase of a parking vehicle. The City's 2023-2025 Operating Budget has sufficient funding to cover the program's cost.

Lake Forest PCOs will follow the same enforcement strategy implemented by the OCSD Community Services Officers. The City aims to change the behavior of motorists through the in-house parking enforcement program, not issue more citations.

BOGO IS BACK!

Double Your Dollars & Support Local Businesses in Lake Forest

Looking for a great deal and a chance to support your favorite local businesses? The City of Lake Forest's Shop and Dine Buy-One-Get-One Community Gift Card Program is back for its sixth phase, and that means BOGO is back!

Need some work done on your car? Looking to try a new restaurant? The City can help you with that.

Phase 6 of the Shop and Dine Buy-One-Get-One Community Gift Card Program is now live. Participants can buy up to three gift cards of \$50 or \$100 and receive matching cards of equal value from the City.

The BOGO program began in 2022 to help businesses recover from COVID. More than 100 businesses are a part of the program and nearly \$3 million has been pumped into the local economy. In January 2024, the City Council approved the sixth phase, adding \$565,000 to the program.

Businesses are encouraged to register to become part of the program. The gift cards are electronic, so accepting them is just like accepting any credit card. Participating businesses are listed on the City's website, so participating in the program is a great way to attract new customers.

Lake Forest can offer this BOGO deal because of its long history of fiscally prudent decisions. The City remains debt-free, all of its revenue is spent on improving the community and providing services.

LOCAL STREET VENDORS POSE POTENTIAL HEALTH RISK

Tempted to try an authentic taco at one of those stands popping up in Lake Forest and throughout Orange County? Here's what you should know:

None of the street vendors selling hot food in the City have a health permit and are not inspected by the health department or any other agency.

Consumption of food or beverages made or sold by unpermitted street vendors can result in a foodborne illness. These vendors often have unsafe cooking environments, do not follow proper food safety and handwashing practices, and discard oil, grease, and other waste in storm drain systems polluting local creeks and the ocean.

California Senate Bill 946 allows street vendors to sell merchandise on public sidewalks as long as they do not violate the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The law does not require them to have a permit from the City and prohibits cities from enforcing criminal penalties. However, the sale of food from mobile facilities like

street carts must comply with the Orange County Health requirements - and typically, the sale of any cooked or prepared food requires a permit from the County.

Lake Forest has ramped up its efforts to help protect the health and safety of residents and visitors. City staff, the Orange County Sheriff's Department, and the Orange County Health Care Agency have shut down nearly 10 illegal vendors in the past couple of months.

The County, City, and representatives from other South OC cities have met to discuss the best way to handle the renegade vendors.

YEAR IN REVIEW 2023

REFLECTING FORWARD: A YEAR IN REVIEW AND THE ROAD AHEAD

PUBLIC SAFETY

Public safety plays an important role in maintaining a high quality life for residents and remains a top priority for the City. Within a year of Lake Forest launching its Catalytic Converter Theft Deterrent Mitigation Program, thefts of the smog devices dropped in the community. The City also launched an E-Bike Regulation Awareness Program after the City Council amended the City's ordinances to include e-bikes. The Orange County Sheriff's Department implemented a special program in the summer of 2023 to ensure e-bike ordinances were enforced. The City's new and first female Chief of Police Services, Captain Christine Berryman implemented the program.

NOTABLE

The City also celebrated a birthday in 2023: The Etnies Skatepark of Lake Forest turned 20 on December 13. The skatepark – one the largest in the nation – was voted for the sixth year in a row as 'the best skatepark' by the 2023-24 Parenting OC Readers' Choice magazine.







CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Lake Forest continued to meet its goal of being a well-planned, attractive, and safe community through various projects and improvements. Significant asphalt repairs were made along Rockfield Blvd. and Orchard Rd. and lighting was added to the greenbelt at Packard Place after residents voiced their concerns.

Public Works completed renovations at Vintage, Sundowner, Borrego Overlook, and Rancho Serrano parks, and added additional lighting at Portola Park's pickleball and volleyball courts as well as the dog park.



Lake Forest remains debt-free and financially stable with its reserves above target and revenues remaining strong.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Lake Forest welcomed two more affordable housing projects: Mountain View by the Post Office, and the first mixed-use, the Portola Senior Apartments. Lake Forest also celebrated the groundbreaking of its fourth affordable housing project, the Meadows Senior Apartments.

CITY NEWS

Lake Forest has a long tradition of planning for the future. The City rolls out new services, programs, and resources annually through the implementation of its Seven-Year Strategic Plan.

The Strategic Plan focuses on Lake Forest's mission and vision of delivering innovative, high-quality services cost-effectively while being a safe and financially sustainable community that celebrates its forests, creeks, and natural amenities. The plan is revised often to include a variety of programs and projects to achieve the City's long-range goals and respond effectively to the needs of residents well into the future.

YEAR AHEAD 2024





With its rock-solid finances, the City braces itself for the exciting prospects that lay ahead this year.

PARKING

The City is rolling out an in-house parking enforcement program to increase enforcement across the community and facilitate cleaner neighborhood streets. The goal is not to increase the number of tickets written but to ensure parking regulations are followed. Enforcing parking regulations will also clear the way for street sweepers, bringing cleaner communities and preventing pollution.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Several projects are underway to help enhance the quality of life for residents. The relaunch of Taste of Lake Forest is in the works. The event will take place on May 11 and include local restaurants, a new location, and revamped features.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Public Works will begin construction on Trabuco Road to enhance traffic flow, install a box lacrosse rink at Foothill Ranch Community Park, and finish replacing city street signs in southwest Lake Forest with the new blue street signs.

Other projects are in the design phase, including synthetic turf replacement at Barker Ranch Dog Park, lighting at Heroes Park, updates at Etnies Skatepark of Lake Forest, and more.

FEES

A Biennial Fee Study that looks at the fees charged at Lake Forest facilities and fees charged for services in nearby cities will launch this year. The study will ensure the City's fees are in line with the cost of the service, other neighboring city facilities, and market value.

LAKE FOREST'S FOURTH AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT IS UNDERWAY

The foundation is set, framing is up, and work is underway for 65 affordable apartments at The Meadows on Bake Pkwy and Rancho Pkwy.

Seniors 62 years and older earning 50 percent or less of the Area Median Income (AMI), which is no more than \$50,250 annually, will soon call this place home. The two-story complex will offer 52 one-bedroom and 13 twobedroom apartments, seven of which will be reserved for permanent supportive housing.

C&C Development and The Waterford Group are the developers of the project and currently own and operate 3,000 affordable units within the region.

The Meadows Senior Apartments are minutes from retail stores, restaurants, and more than 20 acres of parks, open space, and a habitat restoration area. The Interest List for the community is open. Applications can be found at www.meadowsseniors.com.

Lake Forest will have more than 380 affordable housing units once the Meadows Senior Apartments is finished in 2024. Visit www.lakeforestca.gov/affordablehousing to see all the affordable housing communities in the City.



AFFORDABLE ADU LOAN PROGRAM OFFERED IN ORANGE COUNTY

Nearly 30 Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) have popped up throughout Lake Forest in the last two decades to serve as secondary housing or rentals for homeowners.

An ADU is a secondary dwelling unit with complete, independent living facilities for one or more people, typically taking one of three forms:

- 1. Detached: The unit is separate from the primary residential structure.
- 2. Attached: The unit is connected to the primary residential structure.
- 3. Repurposed existing space: Space within the primary residence such as a master bedroom or garage converted into an independent living unit.

For homeowners looking to add a rental space to their property, the Orange County Housing Finance Trust is offering an Affordable ADU Loan Program. The program will provide a deferred, low-interest, and partially forgivable loan to homeowners who agree to rent their ADU for 10 years to a very low-income tenant(s).

BIKE LANE IMPROVEMENTS SET FOR CITY STREETS

Paving the Way for Safer, Smoother Cycling with Bike Lane Upgrades

Don't be alarmed if you see green paint on Lake Forest streets - the new striping color is to alert motorists and bicyclists of where merging may take place.

A majority of Lake Forest arterial streets have on-street bike lanes that are typically adjacent to high-speed traffic. Concerns about safer cycling and sidewalk sharing between motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists have grown in recent years with the rise of bicyclists on City streets.

To help increase mobility opportunities for road users, reduce the risk of accidents or collisions, and provide direct connectivity to off-street trails and neighboring

communities, the City will enhance bike lanes as a part of upcoming and future pavement rehabilitation and slurry seal projects.

The bike enhancements will include narrowing travel lanes where the street is wider than necessary to add a buffered lane between the travel lane and the bike lane. Green stripes will be added along the on-street bike lanes in possible traffic conflict zones.

These bike lane improvements will not take away from the roadways; they will be added to streets where additional space is already available, along with a connection to local trails.



SAVE WATER, MONEY, AND OUR LOCAL RESOURCES

As you may know, up to 70 percent of residential water use is for landscape irrigation. An unhealthy irrigation system can cost you money, waste our water resources, and contribute to pollution. Paying a little attention to your irrigation system to eliminate runoff fights pollution, conserves our limited water resources, and saves you money!

The irrigation controller is the most important part of your irrigation system. The controller is used to maintain a weekly watering schedule – and should be reviewed and adjusted periodically to ensure that your landscape is receiving the right amount of water it needs to be healthy. Plants have different needs throughout the year – more in the spring and summer, and less in the fall and winter.

Irrigation controllers can have many programming features, including multiple start times (time of day) as well as run times (duration), a rain delay feature, even smart technology, depending on the type of controller. Most devices also have a backup battery, which needs to be replaced periodically – if the controller loses power (during a power outage), it will reset to its factory settings – which can be excessive!

Sprinkler lines and sprinkler heads are also a critical part of your irrigation system. Leaks and breaks in this part of your system can result in large amounts of water being wasted and contribute to pollution. Turn your system on occasionally and see what it does... inspect for leaks and breaks or missing sprinkler heads, and make repairs as needed. Watch for misdirected sprinklers too – there is no benefit in watering the sidewalk or your driveway!

Becoming more familiar with your irrigation system, reading the irrigation controller owner's manual, and reviewing the resources provided by your local water district can all lead to a healthier irrigation system, protect the environment, and save you money! HERE ARE A FEW SMART TIPS TO MAINTAINING A HEALTHY LANDSCAPE AND IRRIGATION SYSTEM



- Review and adjust your watering schedule periodically. Remember that plants do not need to be watered every day, and need less water during the fall and winter than in the spring and summer.
- Program your controller with multiple start times, and shorter run times – called "cycling" – this promotes deeper watering and healthier root growth, while also reducing runoff.
- Use a water calculator at: www.bewaterwise. com/calculator.html
- Replace the backup battery in your Irrigation Controller annually.
- Use the rain delay feature when rain events

EXPAND THE FOREST—A LANDSCAPE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Expand the Forest is a landscape-improvement project that encourages citizen participation in tree planting and provides an opportunity to enhance the City's urban forest.

An Expand the Forest memorial tree is \$93. The application includes an approved tree palette and available parks. Citizen sponsors receive a formal Certificate of Dedication signed by the City Council.

The spring planting season is March 1 to June 1. Visit www.lakeforestca.gov/expandtheforest for more details and an application.

How to Participate and Apply

An application is required for participants of the Expand

the Forest program. The application includes a selected tree palette of approved trees and available parks. Note that each park is preplanned to accommodate specific tree types and locations, so not all types of trees will be available for all parks.

Submit an application indicating your tree and park preference, along with a check for \$93 made out to "The City of Lake Forest." The fee includes a 15 gallon tree, location study, planting, staking, fertilization, and other maintenance as needed.
