



NOTIFICATION TO BUSINESSES REGARDING EXPANDED STAGE 2 OPENINGS as of May 21, 2020

The County of Orange has requested approval from the Governor's Office to authorize additional businesses identified in Stage 2 to reopen with modifications. Expanded Stage 2 industries include:

- Retail shopping
- Personal services, limited to: car washes, pet grooming, tanning facilities and landscape gardening
- Office-based businesses (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Dine-in restaurants (amenities like bars or gaming areas are not permitted)
- Schools

Lake Forest businesses must follow all State and County guidance.

2: Prior to reopening, complete the following process per the California Department of Public Health:

1. Perform a detailed risk assessment and implement a site-specific protection plan
2. Train employees on how to limit the spread of COVID-19, including how to screen themselves for symptoms and stay home if they have them
3. Implement individual control measures and screenings
4. Implement disinfecting protocols
5. Implement physical distancing guidelines

PHASE 3 BUSINESSES MAY NOT OPEN. THESE BUSINESSES INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- Personal services such as hair and nail salons, gyms and fitness facilities
- Hospitality services, such as bars, wineries, tasting rooms and lounges
- Entertainment venues, such as movie theaters, gaming and arcade venues, pro sports, and libraries
- Community centers, public pools, playgrounds, and picnic areas
- Religious services and cultural ceremonies
- Theme parks
- Hotels/lodging for leisure and tourism
