For your safety, please observe the following regulations in preparing for your visit to the HHWCC:

- Household Hazardous Waste Collection Centers can only accept wastes from Orange County residents. Waste will not be accepted from businesses, churches, schools, nonprofit organizations or government agencies.
- A maximum of 60 gallons or 600 pounds may be transported per vehicle, per trip (Department of Transportation Requirements). It is illegal to exceed these limits.
- Containers larger than these values will not be accepted.
- Containers will NOT be returned, except for oil containers, upon request.
- Hazardous waste in original containers (except motor oil, kerosene and antifreeze).
- All containers must have lids, be sturdy, non-leaking, labeled and protected from leakage.
- Do not combine different types of waste.

Orange County residents can choose up to five items per week from a selection of gently used containers of household paint and oil-rain products.



## City Council Highlights

**May 7, 2019**

### **I-5/EL TORO ROAD INTERCHANGE PROJECT DISCUSSION (Agenda Item 14)**

City Council discussed the impending Caltrans project that is designed to address congestion and queuing on southbound I-5 at El Toro Road and other traffic issues at this interchange. The project is currently in the environmental review phase. Currently, there are 4 alternatives being studied. At the conclusion of the environmental process, a single build alternative will be selected by Caltrans. The City Council was not required to recommend a preferred alternative. However, the Council unanimously supported option 4.

### **RECOGNITION OF COMMUNITY HEROES (Agenda Item 6)**

On April 16, 2019, an individual committed several crimes within a residential neighborhood. Due to the quick action and awareness of several community members, the individual was apprehended, and aid was rendered to the injured victims until the Orange County Sheriff's Department Deputies arrived on scene. The five following community members were recognized for their heroic actions and contribution to the well-being and safety of the Lake Forest community: Daniel Alexander, Mary Duran, Christopher Gravitt, Kelly Meyer, Marylou Villalobos-Palos.

### **RECOGNITION OF LAKE FOREST BASED AMERICAN YOUTH SOCCER ORGANIZATION REGION 85 EXTRA BOYS U9 TEAM FOR WINNING WESTERN STATES CHAMPIONSHIP (Agenda Item 5)**

After an undefeated season, the Lake Forest AYSO Region 85 Extra Boys U9 team advanced to the AYSO Western State Championship, held at the Lake Forest Sports Park & Recreation Center in March. The team, named the "Rough Riders," won both games at the tournament. This made them the No. 1 team of the Western States, which includes Alaska, Arizona, Nevada, Oregon, Washington and California.

### **PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER ADOPTION OF PROPOSED FEE POLICY AND FEE SCHEDULE (Agenda Item 18)**

City Council considered the updated proposed Fee Schedule report. The report also provided information regarding potential fees associated with a Business Registration System, Permit Parking, and Vehicle Charging Stations for further consideration. Pursuant to State law, fees related to development applications would take effect 90 days from the adoption of the City Council Resolution which is August 19, 2019.
